Leader readers may recall the above picture was submitted by a reader with the hopes of identifying the cast of characters who performed in this play at the Silver Lake Opera House in June 1919 entitled "Teta Mistra Stycha" (The Aunt of Mr. Stych). It was known that that B6 was Joe Vasko and either B5 or B7 was Emil Honzalek.

That photo elicited the following response:

"Dear Tony Kadlec,

I am a family historian of Moravian descent and I just read your article "Pavucina Corner" in the Silver Lake Leader dated November 18, 2010, which my sister recently sent me from Hopkins, MN. In this article you have a picture of a cast of people who performed in a play at the Silver Lake Opera House in June 1919, entitled "Teta Mistra Stycha", and asked for identities of the individuals in the picture. I have this very same picture in my family historical book "The Sustacek's of Minnesota" which was published in year 2003, and I can identify two of these individuals.

Picture identity code B2, is Richard Penaz, b. 8 February 1898 in Silver Lake, son of Frank J. Penas and Antonia Sustacek.

Picture identity code B3, is Mary Emilie Teply, b. 17 November 1897 in Silver Lake, daughter of Joseph Teply and Emma Zich.


Richard Penaz and Mary E. Teply were married 30 December 1919 at the Czech Brethren

Presbyterian Church in Silver Lake.
